Description	HIST201 is one of the common compulsory courses.

Evaluating the stages of change of the Turkish political and social system holistically by considering the experience of the Turkish Revolution within the framework of the restructuring of the modern Turkish nation-state.

Analysis of the internal and external political events of this phenomenon of political, social, economic, and cultural change (transformation), which is shaped and implemented at various levels and in various dimensions, and analysis of the thoughts and activities of all its actors.

Evaluating these historical processes (establishment of the modern Turkish Republic) as a reference and comparison field in solving the problems of today's contemporary Turkish society and politics.



	Comprehending the importance of thinking about the historical dynamism of Turkish social and political change in this context.
Objectives	This course aims to provide students with a basic formation about the historical conditions that made the Turkish Revolution obligatory in the Atatürk period and after, the resistance movement led by Mustafa Kemal Pasha that emerged against the occupation of Anatolia, and the military, political and diplomatic dimensions of this movement.
